# The Ecstasy of the Transfiguration

The synoptists have their own particular way of expressing their understanding of

this innermost reality of Jesus. It is the story of the Transfiguration....

Dimly aware of Jesus' intimacy with God, they realized to that it was in a context of suffering. Throughout his life Jesus' love for his Father and for us was sacrificial. All John's great signs, in which the glory of God in Jesus flashed forth, are set against the background of the paschal sacrifice and the cross of the Lord. The synoptists reveal this understanding too in the story of the Transfiguration.

In the encounter of love and acceptance Jesus is conversing with Moses and Elijah, and the theme is his Death; all Jerusalem is to see the ecstasy of love with which he died. In their daily converse with him his disciples did not wish to hear of it; Peter tried to turn him aside from this course; Jesus insisted. Now the Father bids them listen to Jesus. "For you too there must be a death, a going forth from yourselves, an ecstasy of love, so that you might come to me with the Beloved, to live no longer with your own impoverished, corruptible life, but with my own radiant, eternal life. You were made for this. All that is made was made for this. Come, receive your kingdom!"
